Understand the idea of the Christian 'family' Understand that Sunday is a holy day Linking to English and computing, pupils recount a visit to a local church using digital photographs and find out the meanings of symbols for God that they saw there

Pupils discuss reasons why some people go to mosques, synagogues or churches, often, but other people never go to holy buildings, and why some people pray every day, but others not at all.

Pupils use key words (holy, sacred, scripture, festival, symbol, humanist) to present ideas or write about two different religions or worldviews about which they have learned
